Weba Home Mission Update BAPTISTS

If WEBA churches gave £240,000 (as they did in 2014) this is how it would be used in 2016:

£118,000 (49%) would go to local churches and other mission projects within WEBA as Home Mission grants £119,486 (50%) would come back to WEBA as our core funding

£2514 (1%) would remain to support the rest of our Union


